

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Reader: A reading from the book of Genesis. Genesis 1.26-31 God said, 'Let us make man in our image and likeness to rule the fish in the sea, the birds of heaven, the cattle, all wild animals on earth, and all creatures that crawl upon the earth.' So God created man in his own image; in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. God blessed them and said to them, 'Be fruitful and increase, fill the earth and subdue it, rule over the fish in the sea, the birds of heaven, and every living thing that moves upon the earth.' God also said, 'I give you all plants that bear seed: they shall be yours for food. All green plants I give for food to the wild animals, to all the birds of heaven, and to all creatures on earth, every living creature.' So it was; and God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.

Reader: The word of the Lord. Everyone: Thanks be to God.

This is the very word of the Lord. Listen! I will woo Israel, I will go with her into the wilderness and speak to her heart: there I will restore her vineyards, turning the Valley of Trouble into the Gate of Hope, and there she will answer as in her youth, when she came up out of Egypt. On that day, she shall call me 'My Husband', and shall no more call me 'My Baal'; and I will wipe from her lips the very names of the Baalim; never again shall their names be heard. This is the very word of the Lord.

Then I will make a convent on behalf of Israel with the wild beasts, the birds of the air, and the things that creep on the earth and I will break the bow and sword and weapon of war and sweep them off the earth, so that all living creatures may lie down without fear. I will betroth you to myself for ever, betroth you in lawful wedlock with unfailing devotion and love; I will betroth you to myself to have and to hold, and you shall know the Lord. At that time I will give answer, says the Lord, I will answer for the heavens and they will answer for the earth, and the earth will answer for the corn, the new wine, and the oil, and they will answer for Israel. I shall sow my people anew in the land, and I will show love to my daughter and say to my son, 'You are my people', and he will say, 'My God'.

1 John 3.18-24 NAB

Beloved children, let us love in deed and in truth, and not merely talk about it. Beloved, if our consciences have nothing the charge us with, we can be sure that God is with us and that we will receive at his hands whatever we ask. Why? His commandment is this: we are to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and are to love one another as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he remains in us from the Spirit that he gave us.

1 Corinthians 12.31-13.8

Now I will show you the best way of all: I may speak in tongues of men or of angels, but if I am without love, I am sounding a gong or a clashing cymbal. I may have the gift of prophecy, and know every hidden truth; I may have faith strong enough to move mountains; but if I have no love, I am nothing. I may dole out all I posses, or even give my body to be burnt, but if I have no love, I am none the better. Love is patient; love is kind and envies no one. Love is never boastful, not conceited, nor rude; never selfish, not quick to take offence. Love keeps no score of wrongs; does not gloat over other men's sins, but delights in the truth. As Anna and Andrew give thanks for divine guidance since the beginning of their life together, we pray especially for young people who in their work, their friendships, or within themselves, are in need of God's guidance:

Go before them, Lord, in all their doings, with the light of your love, and further them with your continuous help; so that in all their works, begun, continued, and ended in you,
